EXECUTIVE ORDER }  
No. 104. }

Whereas a controversy has arisen between the municipalities of Rosario, in the Province of La Union, and Alava, in the Province of Pangasinan, as to the location of the boundary line between the said municipalities and provinces, and as to jurisdiction over the barrio commonly known as the barrio of Camp One; and

Whereas, upon careful consideration of the matter, the undersigned has come to the conclusion that the public convenience and interest will be subserved by adjudging jurisdiction over the disputed territory to the municipality of Alava, Province of Pangasinan:

Therefore, pursuant to the provisions of Act Numbered Seventeen hundred and forty-eight, entitled "An Act authorizing the adjustment of provincial and municipal boundaries and authorizing the change of capitals of provinces and subprovinces, as may be necessary from time to time to serve the public convenience and interest," the entire area claimed by the municipality of Rosario, Province of La Union, and the municipality of Alava, Province of Pangasinan, commonly known as the barrio of Camp One, as shown on plan on file in the Executive Bureau files of survey of such area made by Assistant Engineer A. H. Guion of the Bureau of Public Works, is hereby placed within the jurisdiction of the municipality of Alava, Province of Pangasinan.
