Whereas many of the inhabitants of the former municipality of Cainta have petitioned that the same be separated from the municipality of Taytay, Province of Rizal, and reorganized into an independent municipality and have promised to construct a municipal building and enlarge the school building within one year after their separation; and

Whereas the people of the former municipality of Cainta have deposited the amount of five hundred pesos in a bank, the same to be covered into the municipal treasury thereof after the same shall have been constituted into a municipality:

Now, therefore, upon recommendation of the provincial board of Rizal, and the Honorable Sixto de los Angeles, Delegate to the Philippine Assembly from the Second Assembly District of the said province, and pursuant to the provisions of Act Numbered Seventeen hundred and fortyeight, entitled "An Act authorizing the adjustment of provincial and municipal boundaries and authorizing the change of capitals of provinces and subprovinces, as may be necessary from time to time to serve the public convenience and interest," the twenty-two municipalities of the Province of Rizal as established by Acts Numbered Nine hundred and forty-two, Nine hundred and eighty-four, Thirteen hundred and eight. Fourteen hundred and forty-two, Sixteen hundred and twenty-five, and Seventeen hundred and twenty, and Executive Order Numbered twenty, series of nineteen hundred and eight, are hereby increased to twenty-three, by separating the former municipality of Cainta from the present municipality of Taytay, Province of Rizal.

The municipality of Taytay shall consist of its present territory less the territory comprised in the former municipality of Cainta. The municipality of Cainta is hereby reorganized and shall consist of the territory which it comprised prior to the passage of Act Numbered Nine hundred and forty-two: *Provided*, That the salary of the municipal president of the municipality of Cainta shall not exceed two hundred and forty pesos per annum.

The separation herein made shall be effective January first, nineteen hundred and fourteen.
