Upon recommendation of the Honorable, the Secretary of Public Instruction, and it being in the interest of the prosperity and development of the tobacco plantation in the Cagayan Valley, I hereby rule that timber used for the construction of tobacco drying houses or sheds, when such structures are used only by the person by whom owned, is "personal use" within the meaning and purposes of Act Numbered Twenty-one hundred and sixty-five of the Philippine Legislature, and that timber of any kind in the public forests of said valley may be used by the people thereof, under the provisions of and in the manner prescribed by the aforesaid Act Numbered Twenty-one hundred and sixty-five, for the construction of such structures for sheltering tobacco.
