EXECUTIVE ORDER }  
No. 97. }

In view of the recommendations of the Director of Prisons and the Honorable, the Secretary of Public Instruction, Executive Order Numbered four, series of nineteen hundred and eight, providing for the retention in the provincial jail of Pangasinan of all finally convicted Insular prisoners confined therein whose sentences do not exceed six years, is hereby revoked. The status of prisoners confined in the said provincial jail shall hereafter be determined according to the provisions of Act Numbered Seventeen hundred and three as amended, and the transfer to Bilibid Prison of all finally convicted prisoners now or hereafter confined in said provincial jail, who are, according to the provisions of said Act, Insular prisoners, is hereby directed. Hereafter when additional prison labor is needed for the prosecution of provincial public works, the provincial governor shall make requisition for the same upon the Governor-General in the usual manner.
