PROCLAMATION NO. 557

DECLARING THE MONTH OF APRIL OF EVERY YEAR AS "BROADCASTER' MONTH"

WHEREAS, Section 24, Article II, of the 1987 CONSTITUTION provides that, "The State recognizes the vital role of communication and information in nation-building";

WHEREAS, the Kapisanan ng mga Brodkaster sa Pilipinas (KBP), a national, non-governmental organization of owners and operators of radio/television stations, has shown its readiness and willingness as disseminator of news and information;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, FIDEL V. RAMOS, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby declare the month of April of every year as "BROADCASTERS' MONTH".

All governmental agencies are hereby enjoined to extend their utmost assistance and cooperation to ensure success in the proper commemoration and observance of the "BROADCASTERS' MONTH."

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the Republic of the Philippines to be affixed.

Nature and Scope of Franchise. private use in its - Subject to maintain and relay

SEC. 2. Manner of Operation of Stations or Facilities. -The existing and future stations or facilities of the grantee shall be constructed and operated in a manner as will at most result only in the minimum interference on the wavelengths or frequencies of the other existing station or stations which may be established by law without in any way diminishing its own right to use its selected wavelengths or frequencies and the quality of transmission or reception thereon as should maximize rendition of the grantee's services and/or the availability thereof.

SEC. 3. Prior Approval of the National Telecommunications Commission. - The grantee shall secure from the National Telecommunications Commission the appropriate permits and licenses for its stations and shall not use any frequency in the radio and television spectrum without having been authorized by the Commission. The Commission, however, shall not unreasonably withhold or delay the grant of any such authority.

SEC. 4. Responsibility to the Public. - The grantee shall provide reasonable public service time to enable the government, through the said broadcasting stations, to reach the population on important public issues; provide at all times sound and balanced programming; promote public participation such as in community programming; assist in the functions of public information and education; conform to the ethics of honest enterprise; and not use its stations for the broadcasting of obscene and indecent language, speech, act or scene, or for the dissemination of deliberately false information or willful misrepresentation to the detriment of the public interest, or to incite, encourage, or assist in subversive or treasonable acts.

SEC. 5. Right of Government. - A special right is hereby reserved to the President of the Philippines in times of rebellion, public peril, calamity, emergency, disaster or disturbance of peace and order, to temporarily take over and operate the stations of the grantee, to temporarily suspend the operation of any station in the interest of public safety, security and public welfare, or to authorize the temporary use and operation thereof by any agency operate

SEC. 6. Term of Franchise. - This franchise shall I term of twenty - five (25) years from the date of approva Act, unless sooner revoked or cancelled. In the event the fails to operate continuously for two (2) years, this franchi be deemed ipso facto revoked.

SEC. 7. Acceptance and Compliance. - Acceptance franchise shall be given in writing within sixty (60) day approval of this Act. Upon giving such acceptance, the shall exercise the privileges granted under thi Nonacceptance shall render the franchise void.

SEC. 8. Tax Provisions. - The grantee, its succes assigns, shall be liable to pay the same taxes on their real buildings and personal property, exclusive of this francother persons or corporations are now or hereafter required by law to pay. In addition thereto, the gran successors or assigns, shall pay a franchise tax equivalent t percent (3%) of all gross receipts of the radio/television b transacted under this franchise by the grantee, its succes assigns, and the said percentage shall be in lieu of all taxes franchise or earnings thereof: Provided, That the gran successors or assigns, shall continue to be liable for incon payable under Title II of the National Internal Revenu pursuant to Section 2 of Executive Order No. 72 unless th enactment is amended or repealed, in which case the ame or repeal shall be applicable thereto.

thereon to the Commissioner of Internal Revenue or I authorized representatives, in accordance with the N Internal Revenue Code, and the return shall be subject to a the Bureau of Internal Revenue.

SEC. 9. Public Ownership. - In compliance w constitutional mandate to democratize ownership of utilities, the herein grantee, its successors or assign continue to maintain its status as a publicly-held cornoration The grantee shall not require any previous censorship of any speech, play, act or scene, or other matter to be broadcast and/or telecast from its stations: *Provided*, That the grantee, during any broadcast and/or telecast, shall cut off from the air the speech, play, act or scene, or other matter being broadcast and/or telecast if the tendency thereof is to propose and/or incite treason, rebellion or sedition; or the language used therein or the theme thereof is indecent or immoral, and willful failure to do so shall constitute a valid cause for the cancellation of this franchise.

SEC. 11. Warranty in Favor of National and Local Governments. – The grantee shall hold the national, provincial, and municipal governments of the Philippines harmless from all claims, accounts, demands or actions arising out of accidents or injuries, whether to property or to persons, caused by the construction or operation of the stations of the grantee.

SEC. 12. Sale, Lease, Transfer, Usufruct, etc. — The grantee shall not lease, transfer, grant the usufruct of, sell nor assign this franchise or the rights and privileges acquired thereunder to any person, firm, company, corporation or other commercial or legal entity, nor merge with any corporation or entity without the prior approval of the Congress of the Philippines. Any person or entity to which this franchise is sold, transferred, or assigned shall be subject to all the same conditions, terms, restrictions, and limitations of this Act.

SEC. 13. Separability Clause. – If any sections or provisions of this Act is held invalid, all the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain valid.

SEC. 14. General Broadcast Policy Law. – The grantee shall comply with and be subject to the provisions of a general broadcast policy law which Congress may nereafter enact.

SFC. 15. Repealability and Nonexclusivity Clauses. This franchise shall be subject to amendment, alteration or repeal by the Congress of the Philippines when the public interest so requires and shall not be interpreted as an exclusive grant of the privileges herein provided for.

SEC. 16. Effectivity Clause. - This Act s fifteen (15) days from its publication in at newspapers of general circulation in the Philippines
