## SECOND DIVISION

## NOTICE

Sirs/Mesdames:

Please take notice that the Court, Second Division, issued a Resolution dated 11 November 2019 which reads as follows:

## **G.R.** No. 242163 (People of the Philippines v. AAA<sup>1</sup>)

After a judicious study of the case, the Court resolves to DISMISS the appeal<sup>2</sup> for failure to sufficiently show that the Court of Appeals (CA) committed any reversible error in the assailed Decision as to warrant the exercise of the Court's appellate jurisdiction.

WHEREFORE, the Court ADOPTS the findings of fact and conclusions of law in the May 25, 2018 Decision<sup>3</sup> of the CA in CA-G.R. CR-HC No. 08234 and AFFIRMS said Decision finding accused-appellant AAA GUILTY beyond reasonable doubt of the crimes of Rape in Criminal Case No. 2012-14290-MK, defined and penalized under Article 266-A of the Revised Penal Code, and Qualified Trafficking in Criminal Case No. 2012-14291-MK, defined and penalized under Section 4 (a), in relation to Section 6 (a) of Republic Act No. (RA) 9208,<sup>4</sup> otherwise known as the Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act of 2003." Accordingly, he is sentenced to suffer the following penalties: (a) reclusion perpetua and to pay  $BBB^5$  the amounts of ₱75,000.00 as civil indemnity, 75,000.00 as moral damages, and 75,000.00 as exemplary damages for Rape; and (b) life imprisonment and to pay BBB the amounts of ₱500,000.00 as moral damages, ₱100,000.00 as exemplary damages,<sup>6</sup> and a fine of ₱2,000,000.00<sup>7</sup> for Qualified Trafficking.

The identity of the victim or any information which could establish or compromise her identity, as well as those of her immediate family or household members, shall be withheld pursuant to RA 7610, entitled "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR STRONGER DETERRENCE AND SPECIAL PROTECTION AGAINST CHILD ABUSE, EXPLOITATION AND DISCRIMINATION, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES," approved on June 17, 1992; RA 9262, entitled "AN ACT DEFINING VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND THEIR CHILDREN, PROVIDING FOR PROTECTIVE MEASURES FOR VICTIMS, PRESCRIBING PENALTIES THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES," approved on March 8, 2004; and Section 40 of A.M. No. 04-10-11-SC, otherwise known as the "Rule on Violence Against Women and Their Children" (November 15, 2004). (See footnote 4 in People v. Cadano, Jr., 729 Phil. 576, 578 [2014], citing People v.
